

Agencies, Boards and Commissions	Farm Practices Review Board
Statute	Farm Practices Act
Purpose	Responsible for responding to written complaints about farming practices, determining normal farm practices, designating codes of practice, and reviewing any proposed enactment, policy or undertaking that may adversely affect an agricultural operation.
Functions	Mediation Roles
Primary Role	Circle: <u>Adjudicative</u> or Non-adjudicative
Material Role	Circle: <u>Strategic Development</u> - Advisory - Professional Organization - Managerial/Oversight
Composition	The Lieutenant Governor in Council shall appoint a Farm Practices Review Board consisting of (A) 3 members who are not farmers (one of whom is designated Vice Chair); and (B) 6 members recommended by farm organizations in the province (one of who is designated Chair)
Formal Qualifications	
Work & Experience Requirements	Knowledge and familiarity about agriculture practice and issues
Skills Required	Mediation and tribunal skills required
Statutory Nomination Requirements	Regulation 3 (1) of the <i>Farm Practices Act</i> states: A letter requesting recommendations for replacement of a board member, where the board member was appointed upon the recommendation of farm organizations pursuant to clause 3(2)(b) of the Act, is sent to all farm organizations listed in the farm Organizations Regulations thirty days prior to expiration of the board member's term.
Traditional Nomination Requirements	
Remuneration	Category A
Anticipated Time Commitments	Annual meeting, training sessions and meetings as required

Other Notes	3-year term - eligible for reappointment.
Vacancies	2 farming members' and 1 non-farming member's terms expired in October, 2006 and 2 farming members' and 1 non-farming member's terms will expire in September, 2007. All 6 members have each served two terms and are ineligible for reappointment.
