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## CHAPTER H-1.1

### HEALTH AND COMMUNITY SERVICES ACT

#### REGULATIONS

Pursuant to section 19 of the *Health and Community Services Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-1.1, Council made the following regulations:

#### PART I REGIONAL AUTHORITIES

1. (1) The West Prince Health Region shall consist of four electoral zones, as set out in Schedule A, with West Prince Health Region
    - (a) one elected board member to represent each zone; and
    - (b) three board members at large who shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in the month of December.
  - (2) The East Prince Health Region shall consist of five electoral zones, as set out in Schedule B, with East Prince Health Region
    - (a) one elected board member to represent each zone; and
    - (b) four board members at large who shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in the month of December.
  - (3) The Queens Health Region shall consist of five electoral zones, as set out in Schedule C, with Queens Health Region
    - (a) one elected board member to represent each zone; and
    - (b) four board members at large who shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in the month of December.
  - (4) The Kings Health Region shall consist of four electoral zones, as set out in Schedule D, with Kings Health Region
    - (a) one elected board member to represent each zone; and
    - (b) three board members at large who shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in the month of December. (EC598/99; 673/01; 629/02)
  - (5) Revoked by EC629/02. Eastern Kings Regional Authority
2. (1) Subject to subsection (2), every candidate for election as a regional authority board member shall be Qualifications for elected board members
    - (a) a Canadian citizen;
    - (b) eighteen years of age or older on election day; and

(c) ordinarily resident in the zone of the regional authority for which the candidate is seeking election for the six months immediately preceding the date of the election.

Ineligibility as  
electoral candidates

(2) The following persons are not eligible for election to the board of a regional authority:

- (a) persons who do not satisfy the requirements of subsection (1);
- (b) employees of any health authority;
- (c) employees of the Department of Health and Social Services;
- (d) physicians who are licensed to practice in the province; and
- (e) any auditor or lawyer representing any health authority.

Removal from  
jurisdiction

(3) Where a board member ceases to be ordinarily resident within the zone for which the board member was elected, the board member's term is deemed to be rescinded upon the date the board member ceased to be ordinarily resident in the zone.

Disqualification of  
elected member

(4) The board may disqualify an elected member from membership on the board where

- (a) the member has been absent from three or more consecutive meetings of the board without reasons satisfactory to the board; or
- (b) while a member of the board, the member has been convicted of an indictable offence that in the opinion of the board renders the member unfit to continue to hold office as a member of the board. (EC598/99; 629/02)

Eligibility to vote

**3.** (1) Subject to subsection (2), in order to be eligible to vote, a person shall

- (a) be eighteen years of age or older on or before the date on which the election is held;
- (b) be a Canadian citizen;
- (c) have been ordinarily resident within the geographic jurisdiction of the regional authority for the 6 months immediately preceding the date of the election; and
- (d) be resident in the geographic jurisdiction of the regional authority on the date of the election.

Eligible where  
resident

(2) Eligible voters shall vote only in the electoral zone of the regional authority in which they reside on the date the election is held. (EC598/99)

Qualifications for  
appointed board  
members

**4.** (1) Subject to subsection (2), every candidate for appointment as a regional authority board member shall be

- (a) a Canadian citizen;
- (b) eighteen years of age or older on the date the appointment becomes effective;

(c) ordinarily resident within the geographic jurisdiction of the regional authority for the six months immediately preceding the date the appointment becomes effective.

(2) The following persons are not eligible for appointment as regional authority board members: Ineligibility of appointed candidates

- (a) persons who do not satisfy the requirements of subsection (1);
- (b) employees of any regional authority;
- (c) employees of the Department of Health and Social Services;
- (d) physicians who are licensed to practice in the province; and
- (e) any auditor or lawyer representing the regional authority.

(3) Notwithstanding clauses (2)(b) and (d), where a vacancy exists in an appointed position on a board and the Minister receives a request from the board advising the Minister that there has been a formal motion of the board, approved by a majority of board members, that a physician be appointed to the board Exception

- (a) the Minister shall notify the Lieutenant Governor in Council of the board's request; and
- (b) the Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint a physician to the board.

(4) Where a board member ceases to be ordinarily resident within the geographic jurisdiction of the regional authority which the board member was appointed to represent, the board member's appointment is deemed to be rescinded upon the date the board member ceases to be ordinarily resident in the geographic jurisdiction of the regional authority. Removal from jurisdiction

(5) The board may disqualify an appointed member from membership on the board where Disqualification of appointed member

- (a) the member has been absent from three or more consecutive meetings of the board without reasons satisfactory to the board; or
  - (b) while a member of the board, the member has been convicted of an indictable offence that in the opinion of the board renders the member unfit to continue to hold office as a member of the board.
- (EC598/99; 160/00)

**5.** The board of every regional authority shall establish procedures to establish and maintain mechanisms to ensure regular and meaningful consultation with and involvement of physicians and employees in the affairs of the regional authority. (EC598/99) Consultation

**6.** (1) Subject to subsection (2) and sections 13 to 17, regional authority board members shall be elected or appointed in accordance with these regulations for a term of three years. Board members term

Board members, appointments	(2) Where an election in a regional authority produces fewer than the prescribed number of board members, the Lieutenant Governor in Council shall appoint persons eligible for election to bring the number of board members to the total number required pursuant to section 1. (EC598/99)
Replacement	<p><b>7.</b> (1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint a replacement for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) an appointed board member position which becomes vacant; and</li> <li>(b) an elected board member position which becomes vacant, to serve until elections are held at the next annual meeting.</li> </ul>
Replacements serve balance of term	<p>(2) Board members</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) appointed pursuant to clause (1)(a); or</li> <li>(b) elected at an annual meeting in an election held pursuant to clause (1)(b) to fill a vacancy in an elected position,</li> </ul> <p>shall serve for the remainder of the term of the board member replaced. (EC598/99)</p>
Regional authorities elections	<p><b>8.</b> (1) Each regional authority shall</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) hold elections at the annual meeting of the regional authority, which shall be held in November of each year; and</li> <li>(b) appoint a nominating committee for the purpose of presenting the name of one candidate for each vacancy to be filled by election at the annual meeting.</li> </ul>
Nominating committee	(2) The board of every regional authority shall appoint a nominating committee at least sixty days prior to an election.
Commencement	(3) Revoked by EC629/02.
Composition	<p>(4) The composition of the nominating committee shall be determined by the board, but shall</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) include at least two board members; and</li> <li>(b) be subject to subsection (5).</li> </ul>
Ineligibility	<p>(5) The following persons are not eligible to be appointed to a nominating committee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) employees of the Department of Health and Social Services;</li> <li>(b) physicians who are entitled to practice in the province; and</li> <li>(c) employees of any regional authority.</li> </ul>
Election candidates presented at annual meeting	(6) The nominating committee of the regional authority shall nominate one or more candidates, as it considers appropriate, for each vacancy on the board to be filled by election at the annual meeting. (EC598/99; 673/01; 629/02)

**8.1** The chief executive officer of each regional authority shall appoint an employee of the regional authority as returning officer for the purposes of conducting elections of board members pursuant to these regulations. (EC629/02)

Returning officer

**8.2** (1) The returning officer shall, at least 17 days prior to the annual meeting of the regional authority, complete and place a Notice of Call for Nominations, as set out in Form 1 of Schedule E, in at least one daily newspaper calling for nominations, for any vacancy on the board, from persons eligible to vote in respect of the vacancy in the election.

Additional candidates — notice of call for nominations

(2) Any two persons eligible to vote in respect of a vacancy on the board may nominate a person who meets the requirements of section 2 as a candidate for election to the vacancy by filing with the returning officer of the regional authority a Nomination Paper, as set out in Form 2 of Schedule E, that is duly completed and signed by those persons and the person nominated.

Nomination Paper

(3) A Nomination Paper must be filed, during regular business, on a day at least seven days prior to the annual meeting of the regional authority.

Filing

(4) A Nomination Paper may be filed in respect of only one candidate.

*Idem*

(5) Any person eligible to vote in respect of a vacancy on the board of a regional authority may, under this section, nominate more than one candidate for the vacancy.

Nomination of more than one candidate

(6) The returning officer shall, during regular business hours,  
(a) attend at his or her office, as indicated on the Notice of Call for Nominations; and  
(b) receive nominations made in accordance with this section during the period commencing on the day a call for nominations is published under subsection (1) and ending on the day Nomination Papers must be filed under subsection (2).

Receipt of nominations

(7) Before an election is carried out at the annual meeting of the regional authority, the returning officer shall announce any nomination of a candidate that the returning officer is satisfied is made and filed with the returning officer in accordance with this section.

Confirmation of nomination

(8) The returning officer shall, on the next working day following the election, provide Nomination Papers filed in respect of the election to the chief executive officer for the regional authority in which the election was held. (EC629/02)

Provision of Nomination Papers

Election	<b>8.3</b> (1) An election shall be carried out where more than one candidate has been nominated under section 8 and 8.2 for a vacancy on the board.
Withdrawal of nomination	(2) A person who is, under sections 8 or 8.2, nominated as a candidate for a vacancy on the board may withdraw the nomination <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) by filing with the returning officer, before the annual meeting of the regional authority, a written and signed statement withdrawing his or her nomination; or</li> <li>(b) by announcing, before the election, his or her withdrawal from the floor at the annual meeting of the regional authority.</li> </ul>
Acclamation	(3) A candidate shall be declared elected by acclamation as a board member where that candidate is the only one nominated for a vacancy on the board, whether the candidate is nominated by the nomination committee or is nominated under section 8.2. (EC629/02)
Duties of eligible voters	<b>9.</b> Every person intending to vote in an election shall <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) sign a Declaration of Voter as set out in Form 3 of Schedule E with the returning officer or the returning officer's designate prior to voting;</li> <li>(b) complete the Write In Ballot as set out in Form 4 of Schedule E and provided by the returning officer or designate indicating the candidate for whom the voter intends to vote; and</li> <li>(c) fold the ballot paper and return it to the returning officer or designate for placement in the ballot box. (EC598/99; 629/02)</li> </ul>
Duties of returning officer	<b>10.</b> (1) The duties of the returning officer are to <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) designate staff of the regional authority to assist in carrying out the duties assigned to the returning officer and to act as election officials as assigned by the returning officer;</li> <li>(b) establish and properly equip polling stations; and</li> <li>(c) ensure materials required to carry out an election are available at the annual meeting of the regional authority.</li> </ul>
Close of poll	(2) At the close of the poll on election day <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) each candidate shall choose one scrutineer to assist in the tabulation of the votes;</li> <li>(b) the returning officer and the scrutineers shall tabulate the votes; and</li> <li>(c) the returning officer shall announce the results of the election after the tabulation of the votes.</li> </ul>
Rejection of ballots	(3) The returning officer shall reject any ballot that <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) contains the name of more than one candidate;</li> <li>(b) contains any writing or mark that could identify the voter;</li> </ul>

- (c) has been torn, defaced, or otherwise handled by the voter so as to identify the voter; or
- (d) has no vote marked on it.

(4) Where, after all ballots cast that have not been rejected pursuant to subsection (3) have been tabulated, two or more candidates are tied for the greatest number of votes, the returning officer shall call for a re-election to be held at the same annual meeting. Tie vote

(5) Only those candidates having an equal number of votes shall be eligible to run in a re-election held pursuant to subsection (4). Eligibility in case of tie vote

- (6) Where a re-election has been held pursuant to subsection (5) Procedure in case of re-election
- (a) the returning officer and the scrutineers chosen pursuant to clause (2)(a) by the candidates tied for the greatest number of votes shall tabulate the votes; and
  - (b) the returning officer shall announce the results of the election after the tabulation of the votes.

(7) Where a re-election held pursuant to subsection (7) results in two or more candidates being tied for the greatest number of votes, the returning officer shall Tie-breaking vote

- (a) write the names of the candidates separately on blank sheets of paper of equal size, colour, and texture;
- (b) fold the sheets in a uniform manner so that the names are concealed;
- (c) deposit the sheets in an opaque receptacle;
- (d) direct a person, other than a candidate or a scrutineer, to withdraw one of the sheets; and
- (e) declare elected the candidate whose name is on the sheet withdrawn pursuant to clause (d).

(8) The returning officer shall complete the Returning Officer's Declaration of Results as set out in Form 5 of Schedule E as soon as the results of the election have been determined and provide a copy of the completed Form 5 of Schedule E to Declaration of Results

- (a) the chief executive officer of the regional authority in which the election was held; and
- (b) the Minister,

on the next working day following the election.

(9) When an election is complete, the returning officer shall deliver to the chief executive officer of the regional authority in which the election was held Delivery of materials

- (a) the ballot boxes;
- (b) the Declaration of Voter Forms; and

(c) all other election materials,  
on the next working day following the election.

Request for a  
recount

(9.1) Where a candidate disputes the results of an election, the candidate may request a recount of the ballots as follows:

- (a) the request must be in writing and signed by the candidate;
- (b) the original request must be filed with the Chief Electoral Officer of Elections PEI no later than two working days after the day of election.

Notification

(9.2) As soon as is practicable after receiving the request for a recount as required by subsection (9.1), the Chief Electoral Officer shall notify the candidates, the returning officer, the chief executive officer of the region in which the election was held, and the Minister of the date, time and place of the recount.

Recount

(9.3) The Chief Electoral Officer shall carry out the recount at the time and place arranged, no later than two working days after the receipt of the request for a recount.

Material to be  
delivered

(9.4) The returning officer shall ensure that the following are delivered to the Chief Electoral Officer prior to the arranged time for the recount:

- (a) all sealed ballot boxes;
- (b) the original copy of the Declaration of Results completed pursuant to subsection 10(8);
- (c) any other requested election materials.

Attendance at  
recount

(9.5) Those who may attend the recount are:

- (a) the Chief Electoral Officer;
- (b) the returning officer;
- (c) the candidates, each of whom may be accompanied by an agent or representative.

Performing the  
recount

(9.6) In performing the recount, the Chief Electoral Officer shall recount the ballots, review any other election materials, and verify or correct the number of votes cast for each candidate and the total number of ballots rejected as recorded in the Declaration of Results.

After recount

(9.7) After determining the results of the recount, the Chief Electoral Officer shall return the ballot boxes and all documentation and provide written certification of the results of the recount to the returning officer.

Confirmation of  
candidate

(9.8) If the result of the recount indicates a tie vote and the recount was requested following a tie-breaking vote pursuant to subsection 10(7), the Chief Electoral Officer shall confirm the candidate declared elected by the returning officer.

(9.9) Where the election did not result in a tie vote, but the recount indicates a tie, the Chief Electoral Officer shall *Idem, where recount indicates tie*

- (a) first carry out the procedures outlined in clauses 10(7)(a) to (c); and
- (b) then withdraw a single sheet from the receptacle and declare elected the candidate whose name appears on the sheet of paper drawn.

(9.10) Immediately following the recount procedure, the returning officer shall complete a Declaration of Recount Results, as set out in Form 6 of Schedule E and submit, before close of business on the first working day after the recount *Declaration of Recount Results*

- (a) the original Declaration of Recount Results to the chief executive officer of the regional authority in which the election was held; and
- (b) a copy of the Declaration of Recount Results to the Minister.

(9.11) Where a recount has been made, the items referred to in subsection (9.4) shall be delivered by the returning officer to the chief executive officer of the regional authority in which the election was held before close of business on the first working day after the recount. *Delivery to chief executive officer of regional authority*

(10) The chief executive officer shall

- (a) retain all materials delivered pursuant to subsection (9) for 14 working days following the election; and
- (b) destroy all materials delivered pursuant to subsection (9) after the expiry of the time period specified in clause (a). (EC598/99; 673/01; 629/02)

*Retention, destruction of materials*

**10.1** (1) The chief executive officer shall retain permanently in the files of the regional authority the following documents that are provided to the chief executive officer under these regulations: *Retention of documents*

- (a) any Nomination Paper provided under subsection 8.2(8);
- (b) any Declaration of Results provided under subsection 10(8);
- (c) any Declaration of Recount Results provided under subsection 10(9.10).

(2) The chief executive officer shall make the documents retained under subsection (1) available for inspection by the public during regular business hours. (EC629/02) *Inspection by public*

**11.** The Minister shall cause the names of the elected members of each regional authority board to be published in the Gazette as soon as practicable after receiving the completed Form 3 from the returning officer. (EC598/99) *Publish names of board members*

- Board to elect chair,  
etc.
- 12.** The board of each regional authority shall
- (a) elect a chair and vice-chair from among its members; and
  - (b) elect any executive members and officers the board considers necessary. (EC598/99)

- (a) an election shall be held in Zone No. 1 in November to elect one member for a term beginning December 31, 2001 and ending December 31, 2004;
  - (b) one member shall be appointed in December for a term beginning December 31, 2001 and ending December 31, 2004. (EC598/99; 673/01)

- 14.** (1) This section applies to the board of the Kings Health Region.
- Calendar year 2002
- (2) During the calendar year 2002

- (a) all members of the board created by the amalgamation order made in November 2002 under subsection 16(2) of the Act shall have their terms rescinded by the Lieutenant Governor in Council as of December 31, 2002;
- (b) elections shall be held in Zone No. 1 and Zone No. 3 in November to elect one member to represent each zone for terms beginning December 31, 2002 and ending December 31, 2005;
- (c) two members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in December for a term beginning December 31, 2002 and ending December 31, 2003;
- (d) two members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in December for a term beginning December 31, 2002 and ending December 31, 2004; and
- (e) one member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in December for a term beginning December 31, 2002 and ending December 31, 2005.

- (a) an election shall be held in Zone No. 4 in November to elect one member for a term beginning December 31, 2004 and ending December 31, 2007; and
- (b) one member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in December for a term beginning December 31, 2004 and ending December 31, 2007. (EC598/99; 673/01; 629/02)

(4) During the calendar year 2001

(a) an election shall be held in Zone No. 4 in November to elect one member for a term beginning December 31, 2001 and ending December 31, 2004;

(b) one member shall be appointed in December for a term beginning December 31, 2001 and ending December 31, 2004. (EC598/99; 673/01)

**16.** (1) This section applies to the board of the East Prince Health Region.

(d) one member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in December for a term beginning December 31, 1999 and ending December 31, 2001; and

(e) two members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in December for a term beginning December 31, 1999 and ending December 31, 2002.

(3) During the calendar year 2000

Calendar year 2000

(a) one member shall be appointed for a term beginning June 30, 2000 and ending November 30, 2001;

(b) elections shall be held in November in Zone No. 1 and Zone No. 2 to elect one member to represent each zone for terms beginning November 30, 2000 and ending November 30, 2003;

(c) one member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in December for a term beginning December 31, 2000 and ending December 31, 2003.

Calendar year 2001

(4) During the calendar year 2001

(a) an election shall be held in November in Zone No. 3 to elect one member for a term beginning December 31, 2001 and ending December 31, 2004;

(b) one member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council for a term beginning December 31, 2001, and ending December 31, 2004. (EC598/99; 673/01)

## PART II PROVINCIAL HEALTH SERVICES ADVISORY COUNCIL

Advisory Council

**18.** (1) Pursuant to section 16.02 of the Act, the Provincial Health Services Advisory Council shall, subject to this section, consist of the following six members:

(a) one member appointed by the Minister for each of the four regional authorities;

(b) the Deputy Minister of Health and Social Services; and

(c) the Chief Executive Officer of the Provincial Health Services Authority.

Nomination of members

(2) The Minister shall appoint, under clause (1)(a), the person who is nominated by the board of a regional authority from among the members of the board.

Voting

(3) A member of the Advisory Council, other than one referred to in clause (1)(b) or (c), may vote at a meeting of the Advisory Council.

Chairperson

(4) The Minister shall designate a chairperson of the Advisory Council from among the members of the Advisory Council appointed under clause (1)(a).

Alternate members

(5) The Minister shall appoint an alternate member for each of the members of the Advisory Council appointed under clause (1)(a).

Qualifications

(6) A person may not be appointed as an alternate member unless the person is a member of the board of a regional authority and is nominated by that board as the alternate member for the regional authority.

- (7) An alternate member for a regional authority may, in the absence of the member for the regional authority, attend and vote at a meeting of the Advisory Council. (EC629/02) Powers
- 19.** (1) The Advisory Council shall meet at least four times in a calendar year and whenever two or more members request a meeting. Meetings
- (2) Any three members or alternate members of the Advisory Council who may vote at a meeting constitute a quorum. Quorum
- (3) In all meetings of the Advisory Council, the votes of the majority of the members shall govern. Majority
- (4) The Chairperson of the Advisory Council shall ensure that minutes are taken at every meeting and that the minutes are retained. (EC629/02) Minutes
- 20.** Subject to these regulations, the Advisory Council shall determine its operating procedures. (EC629/02) Operating procedures
- 21.** The Advisory Council shall, within three months after the end of each fiscal year, submit to the board of directors of the Provincial Health Services Authority an annual report which shall contain Annual report
- (a) a report of all meetings conducted by the Advisory Council during the year; and
- (b) a report of the findings, conclusions and recommendations made by the Council to the board of directors of the Provincial Health Services Authority. (EC629/02)

### PART III PROVINCIAL HEALTH SERVICES AUTHORITY

- 22.** The board of directors of the Provincial Health Services Authority is deemed to be a board under the *Hospitals Act* Hospital Management Regulations (EC574/76), and shall manage the hospitals for which it is responsible in accordance with those regulations. (EC629/02) Hospital Management Regulations
- 23.** The board of directors of the Provincial Health Services Authority shall be paid such remuneration and reimbursed for such expenses as may be authorized by the Minister. (EC629/02) Remuneration
- 24.** The chief executive officer of the Provincial Health Services Authority shall be paid such remuneration and reimbursed for such expenses as the Minister considers appropriate. (EC629/02) Chief Executive Officer
- 25.** The board of directors of the Provincial Health Services Authority may, in writing, delegate to the chief executive officer of the Provincial Delegation of functions

Health Services Authority any of the functions of the board of directors.  
(EC629/02)
