OUR IMPACT

Over the past year!

Community Outreach offices served 480 families across Prince Edward Island.

Anderson House sheltered 66 women and 35 children.

Youth programs were delivered to over 500 students in junior and senior high schools across the province.

OUR SERVICES

Community Outreach Services are confidential support services for abused women and are available in West Prince, East Prince, Queens County and Eastern PEI. Services include one-on-one support, group support, safety assessment and planning, referrals to other agencies, information, advocacy, public education, and more.

Anderson House is the provincial emergency shelter for women and children who are in need of safety because of violence in their lives. Anderson House services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days.

Second Stage Housing offers safe and supportive accommodation for women and children. Units are available in Montague, Charlottetown, Summerside and O'Leary. Residency is up to one year with rent geared-to-income or rent ceiling set by the Department of Community Services and Canada Mortgage & Housing.

Public Education & Training for community groups, businesses and educational institutions. Presentations are designed to meet the needs of the group and are available upon request.

Our support groups include: Liberty, Beyond Liberty, Coping Skills, Who Am I? & Building Relationships, Cooking Economically, and Women and the Law on PEI. They cover many valuable topics such as: why women stay, power and control issues, building trust, individual rights as women, healthy boundaries, relationships with family, relationships involving intimacy, communication and so much more.

Group programming is ongoing and available across the province in O'Leary, Summerside, Charlottetown and Montague. All support groups are facilitated by our outreach coordinators and sometimes include a guest speaker with expertise on a specific topic. All women who stay at Anderson House and/or use Community Outreach Services are encouraged to attend support groups. To ensure there are no barriers to attend group sessions, transportation and child care expenses are provided as needed.
