The Canadian Domestic Violence Conference 6 is a national showcase of ground-breaking grassroots initiatives that address intimate partner violence. This vital conference, held every two years, will feature influential presenters who are bringing about change in community-based groups, academics and government agencies.

This year, the CDVC6 will highlight trailblazing community initiatives designed to challenge social determinants of domestic violence. While primarily challenging sexism, the Conference will also focus on how the field is challenging key issues such as racism, poverty, homophobia, and ableism.

This year will feature Plenary Speakers Lana Well's of the University of Calgary and Donna Coker, Professor of Law at the University of Miami along with Keynote Speakers Paul Lacerte and Raven Lacerte of the Moose Hide Campaign.

7) Thank You from PEI Advisory Council on the Status of Women

Council and staff of the Advisory Council on the Status of Women extend sincere and heartfelt appreciation to everyone who attended the 30th Montreal Massacre Memorial Service on December 6, 2019. The commemoration was a beautiful and moving honouring of the resilience of women. We remember the 14 women who died in Montreal and the 10 women who have been killed in PEI since 1989. We remember the thousands of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls across Canada. We remember and honour all who suffer gender-based sexual violence. Thirty years after the Montreal Massacre, we recommit to ACT.

8) New report - *Family Violence in Canada: A statistical profile, 2018*

The Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics has released their report "Family violence in Canada: A statistical profile, 2018". Using data from the Incident-based Uniform Crime Reporting Survey and Homicide Survey, the report presents information on police-reported family violence against children and youth and against seniors, as well as intimate partner violence.
