4) PEI Status of Women Equality Report Card Released

On Wednesday, June 24, the PEI Advisory Council on the Status of Women (ACSW) released their 2015 Equality Report Card. The Report Card is one of most major projects of the ACSW, released every two years to assess the provincial government's work towards women's equality and diversity goals. The 2015 grade for government was a "C" - unchanged from 2013.

The report brings together information provided by government officials, evaluation and analysis from Council members, and feedback from community organizations. [Click this link](#) for the report and Launch information.

Renewal of PAC's mandate with chair, Ann Sherman, and two initiatives emerging from PAC's work, Triple P Positive Parenting and Enhanced Emergency Sexual Assault Services (EESAS), were recognized as positive accomplishments.

5) Abuse & Neglect of Older Adults Research Team in the Maritimes (ANOART) Environmental Scan Survey

Abuse and neglect of older adults is a health and social problem with profound consequences that affects people from all walks of life. Research shows however that more older women are abused than older men. This may reflect the greater proportion of women among the older adult population or other factors such as ageism, sexism, lower social economic status, poorer health of older adults, and fewer personal resources.

The Maritime Provinces represent some of the highest percentage of senior population in Canada and share many other socio-economic challenges that exacerbate the growing concern about the real potential risk for increased abuse and neglect of older adults. ANOART was formed as a result.

ANOART members share a passion and commitment to the wellbeing of older adults. As part of the process of developing a research plan ANOART is conducting an Environmental Scan Survey to contribute to the knowledge about what is happening in New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island on the issue of abuse of older people in general but more specifically in trying to understand the lived reality of abused older women.

Who can take part in the research study? Participants must be a resident of New Brunswick or Prince Edward Island. While anyone is welcome to complete the survey in these two provinces, the survey is targeted primarily at professionals who work with older adults in some capacity, including those who work with or for older adults who are abused.
