ANNOUNCEMENT DETAILS

1) *Women of Confederation* – short animated film, July 13

Women of Confederation, a short animated film by JoDee Samuelson, will be shown at the City Cinema, Sunday, July 13th. Showings at 2 PM and 3 PM.

[Off-screen applause.] PROFESSOR enters stage left. She shuffles papers, adjusts microphone, clears throat.

PROFESSOR: "We know that the Fathers of Confederation were important to the story of Canada. The thing is: they were all MEN. I would like to point out that women also existed at this time, though they are not in the paintings . . ."

Yes, where were the women in 1864 and what were they doing? Who ironed the collar of Sir John A. MacDonald? Who darned the socks of William Henry Pope? The answer:

women. Even though they could not vote and had few career prospects, women were the great enablers of history.

The short animated film, *Women of Confederation* celebrates the progress of women during the past 150 years, and reminds us that there are plenty of women worthy of being included in the history books. There will be two screenings of *Women of Confederation* at the City Cinema on Sunday, July 13th, at 2 PM & 3 PM, with a reception between shows. All are invited to come and admission is free. This film is a 2014 Project, and is sponsored by the PEI Women's Institute. (also see flyer attached)

JoDee Samuelson lives in Canoe Cove, and is best known for her animated films *The Bath*, *The Sandbox*, *Mabel's Saga*, *Uncle Bob's Hospital Visit*, and *A Brief History of Charlottetown*.

2) MMFF 2014 GRANTS PROGRAM, deadline August 11

The Muriel McQueen Fergusson Foundation is accepting proposals for funding from registered charities, for projects dealing with the problem of family violence.

The organizations selected will be awarded a grant, to a maximum of \$3,000 to undertake projects in areas including counseling, training, public education and educational research.

To be considered for funding, the proposal project must fall into one of the following categories: the operation of emergency shelters and the provision of counseling and other services to victims of family violence; the development of counseling and training programs for the education of counselors working with victims of family violence; the development of public education programs about family violence; the support of educational research into the causes of family violence, and to assist with the education and training of victims of family violence.

The deadline for receiving applications is **Monday, August 11th, 2014**.

The MMFF is committed to being a catalyst for the prevention and elimination of family violence. We do this by increasing the awareness and understanding of its complexity, through: encouraging open dialogue, funding research into the causes and forms of family violence, promoting educational programs and supporting organizations providing services to those impacted by violence and abuse.
