This webinar will showcase a promising practices document created by women from a network of women- and elder-serving organizations from across Canada, all of which offer programs accessible to women who are older and fleeing violence or abuse.

Promising Practices challenges assumptions about women who are older, warns against stereotyping and reflects a lived experience, identifying what practitioners and women who are older want, to meet their unique needs.

REMINDER DETAILS

1) Abuse & Neglect of Older Adults Research Team in the Maritimes (ANOART) Environmental Scan Survey

Abuse and neglect of older adults is a health and social problem with profound consequences that affects people from all walks of life. Research shows however that more older women are abused than older men. This may reflect the greater proportion of women among the older adult population or other factors such as ageism, sexism, lower social economic status, poorer health of older adults, and fewer personal resources.

The Maritime Provinces represent some of the highest percentage of senior population in Canada and share many other socio-economic challenges that exacerbate the growing

concern about the real potential risk for increased abuse and neglect of older adults. ANOART was formed as a result.

ANOART members share a passion and commitment to the wellbeing of older adults. As part of the process of developing a research plan ANOART is conducting an Environmental Scan Survey to contribute to the knowledge about what is happening in New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island on the issue of abuse of older people in general but more specifically in trying to understand the lived reality of abused older women.

Who can take part in the research study? Participants must be a resident of New Brunswick or Prince Edward Island. While anyone is welcome to complete the survey in these two provinces, the survey is targeted primarily at professionals who work with older adults in some capacity, including those who work with or for older adults who are abused.
