

# The Seniors' Home Repair Program

This program is intended to assist with necessary repairs to a senior's principal residence. The applicant must be living in the residence and the deed must be in the applicant's name.

The program will provide assistance to low and moderate income seniors to make necessary repairs to their home.

Repairs of a purely cosmetic nature are NOT eligible.

## How Do I Qualify?

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be 60 years of age or older.
- The combined net income of the applicant and spouse must be no greater than \$35,000 per year (see Line 236 of your Canada Revenue Agency Notice of Assessment).
- You must own the house to be repaired which must be your principal residence.
- The repairs must be essential to the structure of the building as well as your health and safety.

## How Is the Program Administered?

Registrations are sent to the regional offices.

A Housing Services representative will contact you to obtain further details on your repair needs.

## What Assistance Is Available?

The program will contribute 50 per cent of the cost of eligible repairs up to a maximum lifetime grant of \$1,500.

This means that no matter what the cost of the repair, the maximum the program may cover is \$1,500.

## Applicant Responsibility

- Applicants must provide proof of income and a cost estimate for the work. If you are able, please send a copy of your estimate and a copy of your notice of assessment with this registration.
- Applicants must sign a release that work has been completed to their satisfaction before any grant payment will be released.

- The responsibility for the quality of the work lies solely with the applicant.
- The applicant is responsible for ensuring work done meets the relevant provincial codes.
- Repairs should be completed within 45 days after approval.
