

## Changes to PEI Apprenticeship Training Under the Atlantic Apprenticeship Harmonization Project (AAHP)

These changes are for **all** registered apprentices and pre-employment students. **As changes occur the list will be updated.**

### Changes Affecting Terms of Apprenticeship

### Changes Affecting Completion of Apprenticeship

Apprentices who have met all other requirements to be approved by their training officer to write the certification exam <b>will be allowed write their certification exam with 90% of the required time needed to complete apprenticeship.</b> 3 year trades = 5400 hours 4 year trades = 7200 hours	Apprentices who have met all other requirements to be approved by their training officer to write the certification exam <b>must also have the full complement of hours before being approved to write the certification exam.</b> 3 year trades = 5400 hours 4 year trades = 7200 hours	June 26, 2015
Apprentices in a 4 year trade can be approved to write for certification with the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Full complement of hours (8000)</li> <li>• Required skills sign offs completed in log book</li> <li>• Employer Certification Page in log book signed by employer and training officer</li> <li>• Level 1, 2 and 3 exams successfully completed</li> </ul>	Apprentices in a 4 year trade can be approved to write for certification with the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Full complement of hours (7200)</li> <li>• Required skills sign offs completed in log book</li> <li>• Employer Certification Page in log book signed by employer and training officer</li> <li>• Level 1, 2, 3 <b>and 4</b> exams successfully completed</li> </ul> <p><b>Important Note:</b> <b>For those planning to complete their apprenticeship under the “old” policy, they must be approved by their Apprenticeship Training Officer to write the certification exam by September 1, 2016.</b></p>	September 1, 2015

### Changes Affecting Examinations

Apprentices and pre-employment <b>students must wait 3 weeks before re-writing</b> an apprenticeship level exam if they are unsuccessful on the first writing.	Apprentices and pre-employment students <b>must wait 30 calendar days before re-writing</b> an apprenticeship level exam if they are unsuccessful on the first writing.	September 1, 2015
Apprentices and pre-employment students <b>are allowed 3 hours</b> to complete their level exam.	Apprentices and pre-employment students are <b>allowed 4 hours</b> to complete their level exam.	September 1, 2015
Apprentices who are in their final block of training write the level exam on the second last week of training. If they are unsuccessful, they <b>are allowed to re-write the last week of training.</b>	Apprentices who are in their final block of training write the level exam on the second last week of training. If they are unsuccessful, they <b>will have to wait 30 calendar days before re-writing the exam.</b>	September 1, 2015
