

## H1N1 Vaccination Uptake in Prince Edward Island (2009/2010)

A successful H1N1 vaccination program was one of many factors that reduced the morbidity and mortality of Islanders during the H1N1 pandemic.

The table below summarizes the number of Islanders and the percentage of eligible Islanders that received a H1N1 vaccination by specified groups. In summary some of the key points are:

- Just over 58.3% of Islanders received an H1N1 vaccination.
- Island children had excellent uptake rates and were vaccinated in schools and in public health nursing clinics.
- H1N1 vaccine is still available for anyone still seeking it by calling a public health nursing office in your area.
