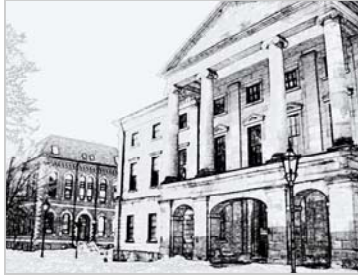

## What's *your* opinion?

Completed in 1847, Province House has been the home of the Island's Legislature continuously since it opened, and in 1966 was designated a National Historic Site. In 1974, an agreement was signed between the Governments of Prince Edward Island and Canada (represented by Parks Canada) concerning the restoration, maintenance, operation and interpretation of Province House as a National Historic Site.

The Standing Committee on Legislative Management has been directed by the Legislative Assembly to review the 1974 agreement and recommend changes that will ensure the long-term structural maintenance of the building, as well as develop Province House as a dynamic place for engaging Islanders through their heritage, their culture, and their Island democracy.
