Prince Edward Island's Heritage Plaque Program

Provincially designated (protected) heritage places can show their pride with a distinctive heritage plague. The navy blue and gold enamel plaques are provided free to identify designated buildings under the *Heritage Places* **Protection Act** . The design features the Island's armorial bearings. A certificate detailing the history of the property is also provided. Eligible buildings include houses, churches, commercial buildings, etc. which are significant due to their history or architectural elements.

The program aim is to identify buildings that played an integral role in Prince Edward Island's development. Charlottetown and Summerside have separate heritage recognition programs within their municipalities.
