OPTION 1: Anne's Land - \$130.00

- ❖ Prince Edward Island Preserve Co. and New Glasgow Country Gardens.
- ❖ North Rustico fishing wharf and lighthouse.
- ❖ Prince Edward Island National Park, stopping at Cavendish beach.
- ❖ Visit Green Gables House.
- ❖ Visit Avonlea Village and attend an afternoon Island Ceilidh.
